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# A message from the Chair

Dear Scout Leaders, Volunteers, Parents & Carers,

I'd like to express my sincere gratitude to our volunteers for your unwavering dedication to keeping our Scout Group thriving. Your commitment to planning and delivering engaging programmes and exceptional experiences for our Beavers, Cubs, and Scouts is truly inspiring.

The invaluable time and effort volunteers dedicate to our young members is the cornerstone of our Group's success. Your dedication ensures that our young members not only have fun but also develop essential life skills. I understand that balancing your personal commitments with volunteering can be challenging, and I want to acknowledge your extraordinary efforts.

For those unfamiliar with The Scout Association Policy, Organisation and Rules, the safeguarding regulations require a specific leader-to-young person ratio as below:

- 1 Leader per every 6 Beavers + 1 to support
- 1 Leader per every 8 Cubs +1 to support
- 1 Leader per every 12 Scouts + 1 to support

To ensure our team can continue to provide exceptional experiences for our young members and accommodate new joiners, I kindly request all parents and carers consider contributing where possible, even if it's for a limited time. Your involvement, no matter how small, can make a significant difference.

I would also like to extend a special thank you to the parents and carers who have already volunteered their time to assist in supporting the Cubs section. Your continued support is essential for the ongoing success of our Group.

Here's a glimpse into some of their adventures:


- Spooky Creations: The Beavers got into the Halloween spirit by creating their own spooky bottles!


Here's a recap of just some of their exciting adventures:

- Adventurous Outings: The Scouts enjoyed thrilling activities like camping and hiking and the Cotswold Marathon!






## **HOW DOES THE GROUP WORK?**
